
## Arrival info.

You are welcome to bring your boats to the academy and drop them off from Tuesday the 12<sup>th</sup> of June, if you would like to sail you will need to pay for a day membership which is £24.20, however on Wednesday the 13<sup>th</sup> you will be able to sail as part of your registration fee.

## Launching & berthing

Berthing will be on the WPNSA pontoons indicated on the map below please berth your boats in the labelled spaces labelled SB20.

On arrival you have two options for launching, if you would like to launch your SB20 by vehicle then you can do so via the deep water slip way shown on the map below. Once you have launched your boat you can bring the road trailers into the main dinghy park for storage during the event, again shown on the map below. If you would like your boats to be craned into the water you will need to bring the boats into the dinghy park, craning will then be available by **WPNSA staff ONLY** from Tuesday the 12<sup>th</sup> please come to reception or you may find our staff located on the craning pier.



## **Access codes**

During your stay with us you will require some access codes to enter and exit through certain areas of the site, your access code will be 4848 this code will gain you access to the main vehicle entrance to the dinghy park and the pedestrian gate next to the main building all other gates will work on 2013. Outside of normal operating hours which does vary you will also require an access code for the changing rooms and toilets please use access code c1739 and turn the handle anticlockwise.

**2013**---all other pedestrian gates around the perimeter.

**4848**---vehicle entrance and pedestrian gate next to main building

**C1739**--- changing rooms and showers out of hours.

## **Crew registration and weighing**

You will need to come to the race office, Room 4 on the first floor of the events hanger between the hours of 17:00-19:00 on Wednesday and 08:00-11:00 Thursday morning to register and be weighed and also collect some site specific information and bow numbers along with the most current sailing instructions. All crews must have been weighed prior to racing on day one of the Championship. Your briefing will be at 10:00 in Spinnakers main function room.

Your official notice board will be a glass kiosk situated in the main event hanger and here you will find all relevant and crucial information for your event.

## **Cafeteria/socials**

There will be a Championship dinner held at WPNSA on Sunday the 17<sup>th</sup> x3 tickets are included in your registration fee, The cafeteria will be open all day from 08:00am.

## **Things to do**


## Summary of Tidal Streams in Weymouth Bay

This information is approximate and is about the back eddy in Weymouth Bay. It runs close inshore and care should be taken to avoid obstructions. It extends for about 500 metres. Its edge is marked by a wave that can be anything from a ripple to an extensive tidal wave, based on High Water Weymouth.


From c4 hours after HW to c5 hours before the next HW all tide is running West.




From c4 hours before HW to c1 Hour before HW there is an East going back eddy.



From c1 hour before HW to c1 hour after HW all the tide is running East.



From c2 hours to c3 hours after HW there is a West going back eddy.
